Mounting and Presentation

All artwork must be matted and framed and ready to be hung for display. All artwork should have the necessary hardware, eyehooks, picture wire or hanger attached. Single centered hangers are discouraged. Please do not submit entries with wet or sticky surfaces. Pastel, chalk and charcoal works must be covered with acetate.

Extremely fragile artwork should not be submitted. Please note that artwork is greatly affected by changes in the weather and humidity. Do not use masking tape or duck tape.

SECTION 2 - PHOTOGRAPHY

- All photos must have been taken by exhibitor.
- 2. All photos will be 8: by 10: only. No frames or mattes.
- 3. Images are to be produced on photographic paper.
- 4. Do not digitally enhance or alter photographs with the exception of classes 220 & 320.
- 5. Minimal color balance, sharpening, and tonal corrections are acceptable.
- 6. Only one entry in each class.
- 7. Photo must have been taken within the last twelve months
- 8. Must not have previously been exhibited in the Carbon County Fair.

Animals – captures the personality of an animal or animals in their natural setting or at play.

Americana - "Norman Rockwell" type shots that often feature barns, pasture scenes, front porches, kids on tire swings.

Landscapes – shows any variety of outdoor scenes which focus on natural landforms and vegetation, and does not focus on people.

Patriotic – subject matter portrays the love of one's country. Could have flags, soldiers, etc.

Portrait - captures the personality of the human subject, either as a head shot or full shot. Props may be included in portraits.

Still Life – focuses on mostly commonplace objects which may be either natural (food, flowers, plants, etc.) or man-made (drinking glasses, books, etc.) in a pleasing arrangement.

Action, Sports – Shows active movement in a sporting activity, focusing on a player(s) caught in action.

Carbon County Fair – photo taken at last year's fair.

Architecture - A shot that focuses on the unique architectural features of a building without a lot of background.

Flowers – Focus on Flowers as the main subject as the main subject of the photo. Can be close up.

Critters - Any type of creature that is a bug or insect that may have surprised your when it appeared.

Micro/Macro – Is extreme close-up photography of usually very small objects.

Weddings - Photography of activities relating to weddings.

Fireworks – Any kind of fireworks.

Sunsets/Sunrises - Focuses in the sky and its variety of colors in a sunrise or sunset and should include landscape, seascape, etc. in the scene.
